

<u>MOONTA STATION</u>

This beautiful old building was erected by Gambling & Son of Adelaide, and opened in 1909.

It replaced an old timber and iron station which was erected in 1878.

The present building is one of several built throughout the state of the same design, including the Wallaroo Railway Station, which has been altered in recent years.

The station is set in spacious grounds, and is now the home of the Moonta Tourist Office.

Open 7 days a week from 9am to 5pm, visitors have access to information on attractions, accommodation, community services and special events.

An extensive display of old photographs, depicting life in Moonta in the 1800's is free of charge and gives an insight into Moonta's rich history.

Ample car, coach, caravan parking available, and public toilets are on site.

Moonta Railway Station

- * 1861 Copper discovered in Moonta
- 1863 Township laid out
- 1866 Horse-drawn tramway opened
- 1878 Line purchased by government and extended to Moonta Bay.
- 1891 Timber & iron station erected. Steam loco's replace trams to Wallaroo. Lineconverted from 5'3" to 3'6" gauge.
- 1896 Record Christmas/New Year crowds flock to Moonta Bay by tram. (10,000)
- 1909 Existing Railway Station built...
- 1927 First broad gauge passenger train departs August 1.'S' Class loco. Station -master Classification 3
- 1931 Tram services cease due to low patronage
- 1947 Stationmaster reclassified to 4.
- 1949 Commendation award to SM Mitchell, porter, for prompt action displayed at risk of personal injury in moving a 9000 gallon petrol tank standing next to a railcar which had caught fire.
- 1961 1²¹ Class passenger service withdrawn from Moonta - Adelaide line Sundays & Mondays.
- 1962 First Class passenger travel deleted completely.
- 1969 Moonta-Brinkworth passenger service ceases.
 Road passenger transport commences from Moonta-Adelaide.
- 1971 Stationmaster & 2 employees staff the station.
- 1973 Stationmaster withdrawn. Porter in charge. SAR recommends closure of Moonta-Wallaroo line.
- 1974 Demolition of stockyards & oil shed.
- 1978 Station closed for receipt & delivery of goods.
- 1979 Station closed.
- 1982 Crossing warning signs removed.
- 1984 Moonta -wallaroo line removed,
- 1985 Station becomes part of Moonta Mines State Heritage Area
- 1997 Station re-opens as Moonta Station Visitor Information Centre
